



**INFORMATION SHEET**

*Please read through carefully for your own safety!*

Due to the age and state of the premises visitors to the Jewish graveyard must be aware of certain risks.

Such risks include

- branches falling from trees
- old trees
- damaged tombs (borders and covering)
- falling tomb stones

and are dangerous for all visitors.

We also point out that particular caution is of the essence when stepping onto lawns due to arbitrary holes in the soil and other irregularities. Please make sure to ascertain the state of the underground when first arriving at the graveyard.

It is strictly forbidden to lean against tombstones.

As a consequence of the possible threats described above visitors run the risk of suffering severe injuries. For this reason the graveyard is not open to the public. We therefore kindly ask you to assess whether you can take the risk prior to entering the graveyard. We particularly draw your attention to the fact that children and elderly people are in great danger from irregularities of the soil and damaged tombs. Accompanying persons hence have a particular obligation to pay special attention when visiting the graveyard with children or handicapped persons.
